



## **Crewe United FC** **Code Of Conduct**

### **THE MANAGEMENT/COACHES CHARTER**

1. Management/Coaches must respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person and treat everyone equally within the context of the sport.
2. Management/Coaches must place the well being and safety of the players above the development of performance.
3. Management/Coaches must develop an appropriate working relationship with players, based on mutual trust and respect. Coaches must not exert undue influence to obtain personal benefit or reward.
4. Management/Coaches must encourage players to accept responsibility for their own behaviour.
5. Coaches should hold up to date nationally recognised coaching qualifications.
6. Management/Coaches must ensure the activities they direct or advocate are appropriate for the ability of the individual.
7. Management/Coaches should, at the outset, clarify with players exactly what is expected of them and what players are entitled to expect from their management/coaches.
8. Management/Coaches should co-operate fully with other specialists (e.g. other coaches, officials, doctors, and physiotherapists) in the best interest of the player.
9. Management/Coaches should always promote the positive aspects of their sport (e.g. fair play) and never condone rule violations or the use of prohibited substances.
10. Management/Coaches must adhere to the rules of the Club, League and Competition rules in which the club competes (Mid Ulster League, Co. Antrim FA & IFA).
11. Management/Coaches must consistently display high standards of behaviour and appearance. Tracksuits and other uniform issued by Crewe United Football Club must be worn at all coaching sessions. Management/Coaches should arrive for coaching sessions in good time and have the session prepared

prior to the arrival of the players. Failure to arrive on time may result in a fine being incurred.

### **THE PLAYERS CHARTER**

1. All players shall uphold the good name of Crewe United Football Club in the manner that they play, and conduct themselves correctly both on and off the field of play. If any complaint is received regarding a players conduct, the matter will be investigated by the Committee of the Crewe United Football Club. If a players standard of behaviour is found to have dropped below that required by Crewe United Football Club, the Player may ultimately be asked to leave the club.
2. All players are required to uphold the principles of fair play and fighting or violence of any kind will not be tolerated. Any incidents will be reported to the Committee of Crewe United Football Club, who will take such steps as is necessary to deal with the Player.
3. Players must adhere to the rules of the Club, League and Competition rules in which the club competes (Mid Ulster League, Co. Antrim FA & IFA).
4. Players must treat all managers, coaches, volunteers, fellow teammates and staff with respect. Any player deemed to use inappropriate behaviour to any person named above shall initially be reprimanded by management/coach. If the incident is deemed to be of a serious or continued nature, the matter will be reported to the Committee of Crewe United Football Club, who will take such steps as is necessary to deal with the Player.
5. Players shall pay all weekly subs promptly as decided by team management and management reserve the right to suspend any player who fails to pay subs as required.
6. Players shall participate in all coaching sessions and games as organised by their management/coach. Players must ensure that they arrive at all match and training venues at the appointed times. Players who are unable to attend must txt/call management at least 4 hours prior to any match/training. Those players arriving late may be subject to fines at the discretion of management.
7. Players must be responsible for all personal belongings and ensure nothing is left after training either at the training areas or pitches. Crewe United Football Club shall not be responsible for any loss or damage of personal belongings.
8. Players shall treat all property belonging to Crewe United Football Club and other participants in Crewe United Football Club with respect and shall not damage any of it including training equipment and the changing rooms and surrounds
9. An annual subscription will be charge for the amount of £35. Players have the option to pay this as a stand alone amount or receive a complimentary formal

ticket in return. The annual formal is held each October and subscriptions will be collected as this time
